5U Schoolyard Jamboree

For Players Born in 2014

Your registration is for both fall and spring seasons. Teams formed in the fall have seven one hour sessions. Players are added in the spring, if there is space, and then play another seven sessions.

The Schoolyard players and their parents are introduced to the beautiful game of soccer in a pressure free setting. Facilitated by a certified coach, there will be fun games that encourage skill development and will end with a 20 minute Jamboree scrimmage where the kids have 3v3 games. AYSO uses the Parent with Player concept that each player will have a parent (or other adult) present to do some partnering during the early part of the session.

Jamboree Rules for Parent Helpers

Kickoff: Beginning the game. Place the game ball on the hash mark indicating the center of the centerline. The ref will assign a team for kickoff. The other team is positioned at least five yards from the ball. Blow the whistle to start the game.

Goal Kick: There is a goal kick whenever the ball goes over the end line and this includes when a goal is scored. The ball is always awarded to the team defending that goal (the team at that end) regardless of which team touched it last (no corner kicks). The ball is placed two yards out from the goal. The opposing team must be at least five yards from the ball and must wait until the ball is kicked to move toward the ball.

Goals: Announce the goal and restart the game with a goal kick.

Kick-in: There is a kick-in when the ball goes outside a sideline. (The ball has to go completely outside the line before it is whistled out-of-bounds.) The ball is awarded to the team that didn't touch it last. The game will be restarted by a player kicking the ball from the spot on the sideline where the ball went out. The opposing team must position themselves at least five yards from the ball.

Other Stoppages: Kicking another player, tripping, handling the ball (flagrant/obvious/repeated), pushing and grabbing. The idea is to gently teach the rules and play safely using good sportsmanship (playing respectfully). After a quick safety/rule explanation, award the ball to the deserving team. If there is a safety concern about any situation, blow the whistle.

Everyone Helps Set-up and Tear-down the Fields

The first team to play on the field brings the goals and other gear clearly marked 5U from the area by the sheds. Please arrive 15 minutes early. At the end of the session, assist by resetting the field for the next team.

The last team to play on the field packs all the gear and takes it back to the sheds. Please arrive early enough to assist in resetting the field for your session.

The Goal of it all:

Let them PLAY and have FUN!

We Are a Volunteer Organization

Our region has been in Corvallis for 40 years, serving an average of 1,200 players per year, enriching the lives of about 12,870 different kids. We are administered entirely by volunteers and in order to provide a quality program, we need **YOU!**

For 5U, this is a minimal time commitment to be a team parent, a game day or a fields volunteer. Each player family signs up for a task on one game day in each season (see below) or helps to re-line our 5U fields or acts as a team parent (two families each team). We teach you what is required, and you provide the enthusiasm!

Field Lining Helper

Field 51 is actually two small fields the Jamboree uses. The fields are measured once and lined before the season starts. Then approximately 2-3 times more during each season they should be relined with a simple to use machine pushed along



the faded lines to brighten them up. This would be done after school hours and preferably after mowing which is typically Thursdays. The helper can choose the week to re-line every 2 -3 weeks based on the condition of the fields; however, they'll need to contact the 5U Coordinator to access the needed equipment.
